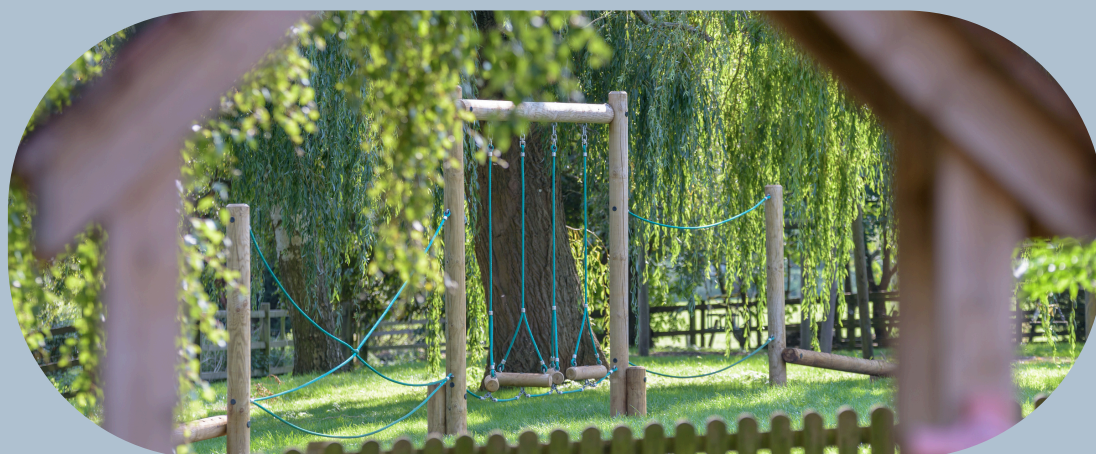

At Wymondham, we aim to provide a happy, caring and vibrant school that will promote high standards of personal achievement and opportunity for full social, emotional and spiritual development of all the children in our care.

We deliver a rich curriculum in all aspects of learning including the creative arts, with literacy and maths central to our work.

We are split into 3 classes. Class 1 consists of Reception, Year 1 and 2 being taught by Miss Singleton and Miss Adcock.

In so doing, our vision is that our whole community will actively demonstrate: “Have love for one another, a tender heart and a humble mind” so that all may flourish and succeed.





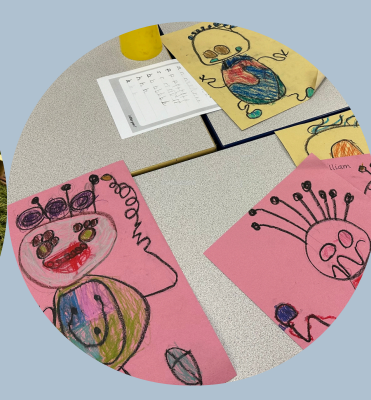
Early Years

The Early Years Foundation Stage spans the period of learning and development from birth to five years old. At Wymondham St Peter's Church of England Primary School, children who join us during the academic year in which they turn five are welcomed into our Reception Class.

We are proud to offer a nurturing and stimulating environment where children begin their school journey with curiosity, creativity, and confidence. Our Reception Class provides a rich and engaging curriculum that supports all areas of early development, laying strong foundations for future learning.

We work closely with a range of feeder pre-schools, nurseries, and childminders in the surrounding area to ensure a smooth and supportive transition for our Reception children. These partnerships help us to understand each child's individual needs and provide continuity in their learning and care.

Our EYFS provision is designed to foster independence, resilience, and a love of learning – all within a caring, Christian ethos that values every child as a unique and capable individual.



Community

Wymondham St Peter's CE Primary School is faithfully supported by a dedicated network of parents, teachers, and friends who provide an invaluable service to our school community.

Through their generous contributions and involvement in special events, funds are raised that go directly towards enriching the children's experience at school. These funds help provide playground equipment, classroom resources, books, and support for school trips, ensuring our pupils benefit from a vibrant and well-equipped learning environment.

We are especially grateful to our Parent Teacher Association (PTA) for their continued support. In addition to fundraising, they kindly provide refreshments at school events such as Sports Day, charity events and seasonal celebrations, helping to create a warm and welcoming atmosphere for all.

The partnership between school and community is at the heart of everything we do, and we are proud of the strong relationships that help our school thrive.

Collective Worship at Wymondham CE Primary School

Collective Worship is a cherished and integral part of our school ethos and daily life. It brings together all members of our school community to share moments of quiet reflection, celebrate life, express thankfulness, and show reverence to God.

Each day, we create time and space for reflection and prayer. Together, we say our special school prayer, along with prayers at lunchtime and home time. Our daily worship focuses on a different Christian Value each week and is led by teachers, children, and special visitors. These sessions include storytelling, hymn singing, and shared themes that invite thoughtful participation and reflection.

Children are encouraged to take an active role in worship, often sharing spontaneous prayers at the end of our sessions.

While most of our worships are held in school and we also walk to our local parish church, St Peter's, for special services with members of the local clergy. In addition, we provide opportunities for children to visit other places of worship, such as Hindu and Sikh temples, helping them to gain meaningful and memorable insights into how different faiths celebrate and worship.

Parents and carers have the right to withdraw their child from Collective Worship if they choose to do so, and we respect and support those decisions.



Operation Encompass

Our school is proud to be part of Operation Encompass, a national initiative that supports children and families who may be affected by domestic abuse. As an Operation Encompass school, we work closely with the police to ensure that our safeguarding team is informed—before the start of the next school day—if a child has been involved in or exposed to a domestic incident.

This timely communication allows us to provide compassionate, tailored support to children when they may need it most. It means we can offer a safe space, understanding, and appropriate pastoral care to help them feel secure and ready to learn. For families, it ensures that we are able to work alongside you with sensitivity, offering reassurance and help from trained staff who understand the challenges you may be facing.

At our school, safeguarding and wellbeing sit at the heart of everything we do. Being an Operation Encompass school strengthens our commitment to ensuring that every child is heard, supported, and nurtured.
